However, please be advised that the final student schedule may not be an exact match to expressed interest due to placement in intervention classes, course enrollment numbers, or teacher availability.

High School Credit

- 8th grade students have the opportunity to take one high school credit course with counselor approval.
- High school credit courses will go on the student's high school transcript and will be factored into their GPA. Students should try to maintain an 85% or higher.

If a student does not pass one or more of the STAAR tests, that student will be required to participate in state-mandated tutoring (HB 1416) and may lose an elective period.

Middle School Grading Policy

2023-2024 School Year*:

- 1. Classwork and homework that is turned in late <u>may</u> result in a maximum of 10% penalty per calendar day. The late penalty is capped at a 30% deduction so that students have the opportunity to demonstrate mastery. Students with the relevant accommodation will be given extra time without penalty. After an assessment, a teacher is not required to accept late work related to that assessment unless unusual circumstances arise, such as illness, family emergency, or death in the family.
- 2. **At a minimum**, any daily grade below 85 that is submitted on time can be corrected for up to an 85, and any late work may be corrected for up to a 70. After an assessment, a teacher is not required to accept corrections on a daily assignment related to that assessment unless unusual circumstances arise, such as illness, family emergency, or death in the family.
- 3. Test Retake Policy: At a minimum, anyone scoring below an 85 can retake the test for up to an 85. The retake can include a test with different questions covering the same content but may also take on various forms (ie: test corrections, written component, oral discussion, etc.) If the test retake is lower than the original score, the higher of the two scores will be recorded. Students must coordinate times for tutorials and a retest. Anyone scoring below a 70 on a test MUST schedule tutoring. All test retakes must be completed prior to the closing of the quarter in which the test was originally given.
- 4. Students and parents should understand that teachers might delay grading and posting grades of late work beyond the normal 3-4 days.

Positive Behavior

2023-2024 School Year*:

Students will earn positive behavior points from teachers. These points can be earned for behavior such as being orderly in the hallways, getting to class on time, contributing to the betterment of their class and school, respecting their peers and teachers, or going above and beyond in schoolwork/organization.

Behavior Consequences

2023-2024 School Year*:

- 1. After a warning, students who engage in poor behavior will be written up on the Student Discipline Log.
- 2. Teachers will describe the poor behavior choices on the Student Discipline Conference Log and contact the parent once an entry is made into the log.
- 3. After the second entry in the Discipline Conference Log, students, parents, and the teacher will discuss possible remedies of the behavior.
- 4. After a student has THREE entries on Discipline Conference Log(s), they will have one day of required detention and a parent/teacher conference.
- 5. Detention duties will be to wipe desks of each room within their hallway, pick up classrooms, or as determined by the teacher. It will NOT be free time.
- 6. After TWO detentions (five entries into the discipline log), the student will be referred to the SSST (Safe and Supportive Schools Team) for further disciplinary action.
- 7. The procedure will continue for every entry after that. On the 9th entry, they will have another detention.
