- **Honors Courses** courses that prepare students for the content, learning strategies, and skills needed to succeed in Advanced Placement and dual enrollment courses
- Advanced Placement (AP) Courses follows college-level curriculum to prepare students for participation in and success on the AP exam given at the end of each school year
 - o By achieving a successful qualifying score on the AP exam, a student may earn college credit from his/her respective college or university.
- **Dual Enrollment Courses** courses in which students work on college-level curriculum while in high school; students earn separate high school and college course grades
 - The University of Texas at Austin OnRamps courses are an example of this course type. Students will register for dual enrollment courses with UT Austin at the beginning of the school year after selecting the dual enrollment course for Trivium Academy.
